Description

Civilian John Lucey His comrades stated that Lucey (31) was shot dead in the chest by a British curfew patrol of the Staffordshire Regiment while they were standing on a street corner and while he was playing with a mouse. Another young man was wounded, apparently by the same curfew patrol. Other accounts indicate that the shooting by the patrol took place in Cattle Market Street (now Glen Ryan Rd.) at about 10:15 p.m. Lucey was badly wounded in the chest and back and was rushed to the North Infirmary, but he was dead upon admission. Lucey lived as a boarder with his relatives, the Cork Corporation employee Andrew O'Connell, his wife Bridget, and their daughter Mary, on North Main Street in Cork. He worked as an engine fitter.
